Notes to financial statement for the year ended 31st March'2016

1.Cowcoody Builders Private Limited(Subsidiary of Joonktollee Tea & Industries Ltd) is a Private Limited Company domiciled in India and Incorporated under the Provisions of the Companies Act'1956.
